

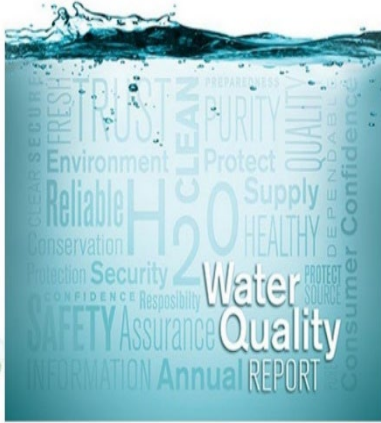

ANNUAL WATER QUALITY REPORT: The Village of Shabbona's Annual Water Quality Report will be available June 1, 2023, online at <http://www.ilrwa.org/CCR/Shabbona.pdf>. This report contains important information about the source and quality of your drinking water, including a Monitoring Violation notice – between 1/1/2020-12/31/2022 we did not complete all monitoring or testing for Synthetic Organic Chemicals (SOC). For a paper copy of the Annual Water Quality Report: you may pick up at the Village Office or the Village Public Works building. Building Permits are required for work performed inside and outside your home or business (Ordinance 8-2-1), **including for new construction, additions, remodeling, siding, roofs, sheds, fences, decks, swimming pools, electrical updates/changes, plumbing updates/changes, structural changes, and demolition.** For questions, please contact B&F Construction Code Services at 847-428-7010. Depending on the scope of work and the completeness of submittal documents for plan review, it can take a up to a week or more before permit will be issued. Please plan projects accordingly. It is the responsibility of the property owner or their contractor to apply for permits and request inspections. The property owner is responsible for ensuring that appropriate building permits are obtained.

Support Nonprofit Organizations During 10th Give DeKalb County

Give DeKalb County celebrates a decade of generosity in 2023. The annual fundraising event features multiple ways to support nonprofit organizations and the Bonus Pool boosts every donation made. Donors can give online all day on May 4, 2023, at [GiveDeKalbCounty.org](https://www.GiveDeKalbCounty.org). Between April 20 and May 4, those who prefer to donate by check can print a donation form from the website and give by mail. Donations from Individual Retirement Accounts (IRA) are accepted and follow the mail-in guidelines.

Give DeKalb County is coordinated by the [DeKalb County Nonprofit Partnership](https://www.DeKalbCountyNonprofitPartnership.org) (DCNP), a program of the [DeKalb County Community Foundation](https://www.DeKalbCountyCommunityFoundation.org). The previous nine giving days raised over \$6.8 million through 38,651 donations combined.

In 2022, Give DeKalb County raised over \$1.5 million from 7,626 donations. Donors gave back from all 50 states and 4 countries around the world.

From midnight to midnight on May 4, donors can give online at [GiveDeKalbCounty.org](https://www.GiveDeKalbCounty.org). Donors can search for a specific organization or browse by causes such as: Arts and Culture, Education, or Human Services. In April, a mail-in donation form will be added to the website. Donors who prefer to give by personal check can print the form, indicate the organization(s) and donation amount(s), then write a single check for the total amount payable to "DCCF." The check and donation form can be mailed to the DeKalb County Community Foundation, 475 DeKalb Avenue, Sycamore, IL 60178 - postmarked April 20 - May 4.
