#### **SNOW & ICE REMOVAL:**

Please help keep our streets clear when we have snow. By ordinance vehicles should not be parked on the road during snow and until snow removal is completed. If you are parked on the roadway, please remember to observe the ODD & EVEN Parking Rule.

### **According to house numbers:**

ODD days of the month park on the odd side of the street EVEN days of the month park on the Even side of the street

<u>SIDEWALKS:</u> need to be cleared by the owner, agent, or occupant of a lot that the front or side yard abuts a public sidewalk designated as a Pedestrian Safety Route.

# Garbage Service Update: We have extended our contract with Northern Illinois Disposal, 1/1/23 – 12/31/28. The changes are:

- 1. All household trash outside of carts must be bagged.
- There is a limit of <u>only TWO bulk items per week</u>.
   (Bulk Items: Household items such as chairs, tables, beds, mattresses, too large for tote) If you should have more bulk items, or need an extra tote, please contact Northern Illinois Disposal to make arrangements. 1-800-930-7321. This would be at your expense.
- 3. Garbage rates increased as of 1/1/23. You will now pay \$19.35 per month with a 4% increase each year of the 5 year contract.

Garbage Totes when full should not weigh more than 50 lbs.

<u>Garbage and Recycling Totes</u> are not to be stored on Village sidewalks. They may be put out for pick up the evening before and are to be removed from curb side by the evening of the day of pickup.
