

Happy New Year!

SNOW & ICE REMOVAL:

Please help keep our streets clear when we have snow. By ordinance vehicles should not be parked on the road during snow and until snow removal is completed. If you are parked on the roadway, please remember to observe the ODD & EVEN Parking Rule.

According to house numbers:

ODD days of the month park on the odd side of the street EVEN days of the month park on the Even side of the street

<u>SIDEWALKS:</u> need to be cleared by the owner, agent, or occupant of a lot that the front or side yard abuts a public sidewalk designated as a Pedestrian Safety Route.

Spring 2024 Downtown Streetscape Improvements


Construction along US Route 30 (Comanche Avenue) from Nokomis



Street to Illini Street is scheduled to begin in the spring of 2024. The scope of the project includes improvements on both the north and south sides of Comanche Avenue. Work will be staged, with crews scheduled to begin work on the south side of the street first. The improvements are a continuation of work completed by IDOT at the end of last year and will include curb and sidewalk replacements, new light poles and LED fixtures, and beautification improvements including installation of trees, shrubs, planter boxes, benches, and bicycle racks. These improvements are primarily funded with a \$2M grant the Village received through the Illinois Transportation Enhancement Program (ITEP) administered by IDOT.

While work is being completed, construction crews will make all efforts to provide temporary access to all buildings but there may be times where short-term closures of the sidewalk and parking lanes adjacent to buildings may need to occur. We appreciate your understanding during the construction. Work is expected to begin in March 2024 and be completed by the end of June 2024.

Please contact any Village Board Trustee or the Village President with any questions or concerns. Thank you and we appreciate your cooperation as the improvements are made to the downtown streetscape.

HELP SAVE YOUR LIBRARY

For those of you who are not aware, we have had to cut our hours of operation recently due to lack of funding. We currently receive approximately \$30,788 in tax revenue for the library, and it is currently

costing us approximately \$42,000 a year at a bare minimum to keep the library open. This leaves us with a deficit amount of \$11,200 that we must obtain each year just to keep the library open.

While funding may be very limited, our library attendance and patron base continues to grow. Our daily attendance in FY '21-'22 was 1522, FY'22-'23 increased to 64% for a total of 2505, and in this FY our attendance is already at over 2200 and we are only 75% of the way through our FY. Due to the generosity of community members, volunteers, and donors we have also been able to provide over 40 programs for over 500 people in the community.
